



The Dairy Certificate Program will provide specialized training in dairy science through specific courses, extracurricular activities, and internships. This targeted training will increase your practical skills and knowledge in dairy science. By completing the Dairy Certificate Program, you will be prepared for employment in the dairy production or processing sectors of the allied industries that provide supplies and services to the dairy industry.

To obtain the Dairy Certificate, students must complete the three following program areas:

- a) Course work--Program consists of 24 credit hours (see below)
- b) Dairy related internship (must be approved by the coordinator)
- c) Participate in the Dairy Challenge

Restrictions and General Information

1. This Certificate program is not available to fulfill the minor requirement for students majoring in Animal Sciences through the B.S. in Agriculture.
2. This Certificate program should be declared by the time a student accumulates 60 credit hours.
3. A minimum 2.00 cumulative point-hour ratio is required in the Certificate course work; and a minimum grade of a C- is required for each course used to complete this Certificate.
4. A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and this Certificate program.
5. This Certificate program must contain a minimum of 12 credit hours distinct from the major and/or minor(s).
6. Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count in the Certificate program and no more than 3 credit hours of course work graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the Certificate.
7. No more than 3 credit hours of 3488 (Professional Development in Animal Sciences), 4193 (Individual Studies), 4189 (Field Experience), 4999 (Research with Distinction), or 4999H (Honors Research with Distinction) may count toward the Certificate.
8. A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination toward the Certificate program.
9. At least 12 total credit hours counting in the Certificate must be earned in regular OSU coursework.
10. Equivalent courses taken at ATI will be considered for counting toward the Certificate; however, dairy-related courses taken at ATI used to fulfill the nutrition, genetics, physiology, health, or animal production required for students majoring in Animal Sciences will not count toward the Certificate.
