

AN OHIO STATE DEGREE WITH CFAES

Our college offers four degrees:

- B.S. in Agriculture
- B.S. in Construction Systems Management
- B.S. in Food Science and Technology
- B.S. in Nutrition

Depending on the degree, a significant portion of hours are drawn from a wide range of General Education (GE) credits. In order to earn a degree from The Ohio State University, students complete coursework from five areas:

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BEFORE YOU ARRIVE AT ORIENTATION

It is your responsibility to submit **all** official transcripts immediately after the completion of your course(s). Students enrolled in College Credit Plus/Dual Enrollment must submit official college transcripts, even if these courses appear on the high school transcript. You must request the institution to send the official transcript(s) electronically (preferred) or via physical mail to:

Ohio State's Transfer Credit Center will then evaluate credit and inform you of the results. If you need to have any course(s) further evaluated, especially math, you should do so prior to orientation. More information will be provided when you receive your transfer credit evaluation*.

If you have not received a Transfer Credit Report by Orientation, bring copies of your **courses taken, credit hours earned, and grades earned to Orientation.*

We encourage students to consider courses they are interested in taking before arriving. This will be helpful in identifying classes you want to take for your first semester.

- Consider courses that will **stretch your knowledge base**
- **Be flexible** about course times as too many limits will limit your course options
- **Do not make assumptions** about a course; read the course descriptions and consult an advisor
- Have **back-up courses** in order to account for time conflicts and other limitations

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YOUR CFAES SCHEDULING SESSION

Making course decisions can be overwhelming. For this reason, professional staff and College Academic Counselors will assist you through each step of the scheduling process, including selecting your classes based on your major and applying credit earned through previously college enrollment or AP/IB. Look for:

- Have an understanding of the **curriculum requirements** of their desired major,
- Learn about the **type of courses** they will be taking during their first semester,
- Receive information about the **Day 2 schedule** and scheduling process, and
- Have an opportunity to attend **evening activities** planned by OSU First Year Experience staff.
